EASTPOINTE - *(1 Proposal)*

Public Safety Services - Millage Renewal

Shall the previously voter authorized millage of 7.000 mills for the purpose of maintaining public safety services in the City of Eastpointe be renewed again for 7.000 mills for the period of 2010 through 2014 inclusive for the purpose of maintaining public safety services in the City of Eastpointe, which millage will raise in the first year an estimated \$5,170,696.00?

A PROPOSITION TO AMEND THE CITY CHARTER AND **RENEW** THE LEVY OF ONE MILL AS REDUCED BY HEADLEE ROLLBACK FROM 2004

PROPOSAL A

Shall the City of St. Clair Shores, Michigan, levy of one mill per year for five (5) years approved in 1994 and **renewed** in 1998 and 2004, providing for necessary residential street repairs, street construction, and related sewer repairs and construction, be **renewed** for an additional five (5) years at a reduced millage rate of .9830 mills per \$1000.00 of taxable valuation (.9830) of State taxable value which is estimated to produce \$1,876,344.00 of increased collections in the first

HARRISON TOWNSHIP - *(2 Proposals)*

TOWNSHIP PROPOSAL 1

THIS PROPOSAL TO RENEW FOR ONE YEAR UP TO 6.6876 MILLS TO SUPPORT AND FUND THE OPERATIONS FOR POLICE, FIRE, AND GENERAL OPERATIONS WITHIN THE TOWNSHIP FOR Y2010, AUTHORIZES THE TOWNSHIP TO MAINTAIN THE MILLAGE RATE OF 6.6700 THAT WAS LEVIED LAST YEAR, 2009.

Shall the authorized Charter Millage for General Operations purposes within the Charter Township of Harrison, Macomb County, Michigan be renewed at up to 6.6876 mills (\$6.68 per \$1,000 of taxable value) upon real and tangible personal property, which will raise estimated revenues of \$6,536,903.00 of which up to 4.8000 mills shall be allocated for fire protection services, including vehicles, apparatus, equipment, housing, personnel, and emergency medical and ambulance service; up to 1.3742 mills for police protection services; and up to 0.5134 mills for the general operations within the Township for Year 2010?

TOWNSHIP PROPOSAL 2

HARRISON TOWNSHIP ADVISORY QUESTION REGARDING SOLID WASTE COLLECTION AND DISPOSAL

Shall the Charter Township of Harrison, County of Macomb, State of Michigan, enter into a contract for the collection and disposal of solid waste from all single-family curbside residential properties within the Township such that for the next three (3) years the anticipated fees for single-family residential users will be less than \$14 per month and the anticipated fees for condominium and apartments users will be less than \$11 a month?

VILLAGE OF NEW HAVEN - *(1 Proposal)*

REVENUE BOND PROPOSITION WATER SUPPLY SYSTEM

Shall the Village of New Haven, County of Macomb, Michigan, borrow the principal sum of not to exceed Ten Million Dollars (\$10,000,000), payable in not to exceed thirty (30) years from the date of issue, and issue its water supply system revenue bonds pursuant to Act 94, Public Acts of Michigan, 1933, as amended, payable solely from the revenues of the water supply system of the Village, and in the event of insufficiency of said revenues, payable from the general funds of the Village or, if necessary, from ad valorem taxes levied upon all taxable property in the Village, subject to applicable charter, statutory and constitutional tax rate limitations, for the purpose of paying all or part of the cost of acquiring and constructing water supply system improvements, together with related sites, structures, equipment and appurtenances, to serve the users of the Village of New Haven water supply system?

FRASER PUBLIC SCHOOLS - *(1 Proposal)*

TAX LIMITATION PROPOSAL - OPERATING MILLAGE

This proposal, if approved by the electors, will allow the Fraser Public Schools to levy not more than the statutory rate of 18 mills on all property, except principal residence and other property exempted by law, required for the School District to receive its full revenue per pupil foundation guarantee.

Shall the limitation on the total amount of taxes which may be assessed against all property, except principal residence and other property exempted by law, situated within the Fraser Public Schools, County of Macomb, State of Michigan, be increased as provided in the Michigan Constitution, in the amount of 18 mills on each dollar of taxable value, for a period of five (5) years, from July 1, 2010 through June 30, 2015, inclusive, with 17.7840 mills of the above being a renewal of millage which would otherwise expire on June 30, 2010 and .2160 mill being a restoration of millage lost as a result of the reduction required by the Michigan Constitution of 1963? This millage would provide estimated revenues to the Fraser Public Schools of six million, four hundred and fifty thousand and 00/100 (\$6,450,000) Dollars during the 2010 calendar year, to be used for general operating purposes.

WARREN CONSOLIDATED SCHOOLS DISTRICT COUNTIES OF MACOMB AND OAKLAND

SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT BOND PROPOSITION

Shall the Warren Consolidated Schools District, Counties of Macomb and Oakland, State of Michigan, borrow the sum of not to exceed Sixty-Five Million Seven Hundred Five Thousand and 00/100 (\$65,705,000) Dollars and issue its general obligation unlimited tax bonds therefor, in one or more series, for the purpose of paying for the cost of the following:

WARREN CONSOLIDATED SCHOOLS - *(cont'd)*

- Replacing roofs on school buildings;
- Remodeling, re-equipping, re-furnishing school buildings and other facilities;
- Erecting, equipping and furnishing additions to school buildings;
- Preparing, developing and improving sites at school buildings, playgrounds and other facilities; and
- Equipping and re-equipping school buildings and other facilities for technology systems and equipment and purchasing school buses?

The estimated millage that will be levied to pay the proposed bonds in the first year is 0.00 mills (\$0.00 per \$1,000 of taxable value). The maximum number of years the proposed bonds may be outstanding, exclusive of refunding, is not more than twenty-five (25) years; and the estimated simple average annual millage that will be required to retire the proposed bonds over twenty-five (25) years is 0.79 mills annually (\$0.79 per \$1,000 of taxable value).

If approved by the voters the bonds will be guaranteed by the State of Michigan under Section 16 of Article IX of the State Constitution of 1963, as amended. If the School District borrows from the State of Michigan to pay debt service on the bonds under the State of Michigan's guarantee the School District may be required to levy debt mills beyond the term of the bonds to repay the State of Michigan.

(Pursuant to State law, expenditure of bond proceeds must be audited, and the proceeds cannot be used for teacher, administrator or employee salaries, repair or maintenance costs or other operating expenses.)
